COVID & FLU CAMPAIGN

Yesterday, we sent out our Patient Newsletter which advised patients they can book in for their covid and flu vaccine. Our first clinic is on the 3rd of October and then our big weekend clinic is going to be on the 6th of October 2024. Kate, Jaujar and Mei-Ling are currently the only three people who are being booked in for both flu and covid co-administration clinics.

As the appointments are more than 6 weeks in advance we aren't able to use the self-booking link so we have advised patients to book via the NHS App or they can call reception between 11am and 2pm to book an appointment. Can I please encourage the clinical staff to book patients in for their covid and flu vaccine if they come to see you in the interim.

So, who is eligible?

FLU:

- are aged 65 or over
- · have a certain long-term condition
- pregnant
- live in a care home
- are the main carer for an older or disabled preson, or recieve a carer's allowance.
- Live with someone who has a weakened immune system
- Frontline health and socail care workers

Covid/Both:

- · are aged 65 or over
- immunosuppressed
- live in a care home
- Frontline health and socail care workers
